# Parking Protocol

While on-street parking is perfectly legal, it can cause undue congestion on narrow neighborhood streets. Please park all cars in the street on the same side to make more room for passing vehicles. Follow the rules in our CNHA By-Laws to keep our streets safe and attractive:

- Whenever possible, please keep all vehicles parked in your garage. Our by-laws allow parking not more than 2 cars in driveways but prohibit parking of trucks of any kind.
- Please remove any vehicles from the street before a snow or winter storm event to facilitate snow removal.
- Garage doors shall be in closed position except when needed for entry or exit. This makes homes more attractive and discourages burglars.
- Boats and trailers cannot be left in driveways or yards.

# Celebrate July 4th Safely

We all cringe at the sound of sirens on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July as they raise fears of roof fires started by mishandled fireworks and nasty burns or worse when a roman candle explodes or even a hot sparkler is grabbed by an excited child. Why not keep our houses and children safe this year by celebrating at one of the many great area fireworks displays? Check the newspaper or online for times and locations as the holiday approaches.

Fireworks are illegal in both Kansas City and Gladstone, but if you choose to celebrate at home please do so safely:

- Do not use any fireworks that shoot more than 20 feet in the air
- Keep a bucket of water or sand handy
- Don't let children under 16 handle matches
- Never hold fireworks other than sparklers in your hand

### KCMO Recycling Tips

Kansas City accepts the following items which can now be placed in your recycling bins for curbside pickup on Tuesdays:

- Place metal cans, plastic bottles and containers, cardboard, office paper and books in the blue curbside tubs.
- No glass, plastic bags, styrofoam, motor oil bottles and other automotive product or household hazardous material bottles, paper towels, tissues or napkins, plates or cups, aseptic and waxed containers, like milk cartons or juice boxes, gift wrap, photographs, blueprints, hanging file folders or bags that contained pet food, fertilizer, charcoal or kitty litter
- Obtain additional or replacement bins at Price Chopper or Westlake's Ace Hardware
- Deposit glass for recycling in the convenient purple bin in the front of the Price Chopper parking lot on Vivion Road.

# Mending Fences

Homeowners are reminded that Claymont North By-Laws specify the allowable fencing types and placement, but do not require fencing. If you have a fence that is falling down, or no longer needed, you may remove it rather than incur the expense of repair or replacement.

Please do your part to keep the neighborhood looking its best by maintaining your fences, decks and home exterior. This will help keep our neighborhood a great place to live, and maintain our property values in a difficult housing market.
